HOMEOWNER ASSOCIATION NEWS

reetings all as we transition from spring to summer in our typical unsettled spring and early summer weather patterns.

I hope everyone who needed to find space in the dumpster in May was successful—it was filled to overflowing twice—and letting you know we are working on dates for late September/ early October 2025 for a fall clean up effort. There are a few properties that still have debris piles/old furniture/ building materials on the sides of houses and code enforcement at HOAMCO will be addressing those homeowners directly. Meanwhile I am sharing some thoughts after reviewing Design Review Committee (DRC) requests that have been submitted in recent weeks and some projects where requests for approval have not been submitted. I am aware I have addressed this topic in prior newsletters but we seem to need to continue to discuss it.

Changing house front door color: If you are freshening your house or front door paint with the existing color you do not need to submit a DRC application for approval. But if you are being "creative" and looking for a change any color selections must be consistent with the permitted color schemes and will require approval. Unapproved color selections outside the permitted schemes will require a re-paint at your expense and cause code violation fines until the property is restored. It is also important to make sure any painting is done well and that walls are well-prepared so that the final product looks good. A sloppy execution will also require restoration.

Walls, pergolas, solar panels: Increasing the height of walls is limited to 66 inches (except for party walls) and there are restrictions on the types of materials that can be used. Please make sure you get approval for your wall height, materials and any finishing stucco before you spend the money to do it. Pergolas are generally approved but please consult the HOA Handbook as to height, placement and materials restrictions. Solar panels are generally approved but please submit an application for approval.

Trash Bin Placement: By now everyone should have made it through the first two months of trash service with our new service provider, Road Runner. Code Enforcement is going to resume contacting homeowners who have trash bins visible from the street on non-pick up day. After an initial courtesy, reminder fines will be assessed in increasing amounts until compliance is achieved.

Safety Committee: Lou Miller and I are beginning our investigation of establishing a safety committee in the La Entrada community that would address environmental emergencies, property issues and potential crime prevention as was discussed at the Annual Meeting. We will keep you updated.

pring and summer are upon us again and with them we need to be mindful of things that could adversely affect our companion animals. They are, of course, completely dependent upon our good will, kindness and competence in caring for them. Besides the deleterious effects of excessive heat—dehydration, sunburn, scorched paws—there are numerous diseases to look out for. According to the Humane Society, tick-borne diseases such as Rocky Mountain spotted fever and Lyme Disease are endemic. Others I had never heard of include Babesiosis (parasitic) and Erlichiosis (bacterial), both with ticks as the vector.

Then of course there are the flea-borne illnesses, Plague (!), Tularemia (yikes); and a fungal disease lurking in the soil, Valley Fever. This latter, according to the website, is one to which "dogs in New Mexico are susceptible, particularly in low desert regions".

On a related cautionary note: rattlesnakes flourish here. Another reason to keep your dog leashed while on a walk. There are also rattlesnake aversion classes, what a great idea!
