Re-cap from 11/6/25 HOA Board Meeting:

We had a short board meeting via ZOOM and focused on issues about the frequency of mowing the native grass in the walkway between Rancho Viejo Blvd. and Calle Ancla as it seems the community wants more frequent mowing to reduce the height and wilderness appearance of the area and discussed the reasons for removing but not replacing 4-6

dead trees on Via Sagrada. We also had an update on the progress of the Arroyo Hondo bike path in the greenbelt north of Via Orilla Dorado (VOD) which now has concrete (to

date) between 49-75 Via Orilla Dorado (VOD). This week the project crew seems to be tying both sides of the path at Rancho Viejo Blvd. to the roadway and preparing the forms for more cement pouring between the gravel access road at VOD and Avenue Corre Camino to 49 VOD. We also had a short update on efforts to research establishing a safety committee that could jointly host safety-related events with the safety committees in the other two Rancho Viejo HOA organizations. There will be updates at the annual in-person meeting which we are scheduling for March 5, 2026. We will have an election for the one board seat open to homeowners

and information about the application process to run for this seat will be distributed in January 2026.

Dunn Edwards Paint Coupon Update:

We had a glitch with the paint discount coupon that Dunn Edwards gave us in September 2025 when a homeowner attempted to use it in November but the situation has been resolved. I have posted the coupon information on the La Entrada Facebook page and see the coupon code information on page 4 of this newsletter. The coupon is good for up to a 37% discount on interior and exterior paints and the Dunn Edwards computer system now has all approved paint colors for the four styles of houses in La Entrada. The exception is garage door paint as Dunn Edwards is not the vendor for that paint and one stucco color, however I am told they can match any color. We anticipate having a presentation by Ruby Sedillo from Dunn Edwards at the annual meeting in March.

Bird Feeders:

HOAMCO and the HOA Board have received some complaints from homeowners about bird feeders in neighboring yards that are attracting large groups of pigeons and rodents. As you may be aware pigeons and rodents can cause expensive damage to roofs, especially the flat roof membrane, and to other structural parts and landscape. There is no prohibition in the HOA Handbook about the use of bird feeders but we encourage people to be respectful of their neighbors who don't wish to have pigeons

and rodents in their yards. Many bird seed stores sell feeders that inhibit the release of seed when heavy birds or squirrels sit on the perches and a tray to catch seed before it falls on the ground can be helpful. Wild Birds Unlimited sells a "Squirrel Buster" feeder in two different sizes that they recommend to address the problem. If the problem continues or expands then the board will

La Entrada Sub-Phase 4 Development:


